Whether your car is old or new- a breakdown can happen at any time. When it does, it is important to know how to handle it.

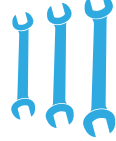
Be prepared and know what to do to get your car back on road.

### BUILD YOURSELF AN EMERGENCY KIT

You'll be ready for anything with right gear:



Heavy duty torch



Socket wrench



First aid kit



Breakdown warning and hazard light



Engine oil



Antifreeze and coolant



Bottle jack



Spare tyre

### In case of car accident

#### Tools required



Phone



Notepad and pen



First aid kit



Check yourself and passengers for injuries. If anyone is injured, call police or ambulance immediately.



Don't move any injured passenger unless there's risk of fire or you're told to be emergency operator.



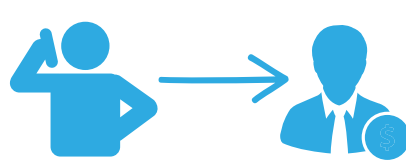
Find out your location by taking note of street signs or landmarks nearby.



Ask anyone who witnessed the accident for their names, addresses and vehicle registration.



Records as many details as possible of what happened. Note the weather, time, state of drivers and take photos if possible.



Call your insurance company to report the accident. If necessary, exchange details with other driver.

#### Mechanic

- If your car is driveable and safe: take to a mechanic for any repairs or proof that the car is roadworthy.
- If your car is un-driveable: call road side assistance for vehicle rescue and recovery.
